- ARTICLE 2.** Shall the voters appropriate the sum of \$6,520,363 for the payment of debts and current expenses of the City for carrying out any of the purposes of the Charter, plus payment of all state and county taxes and obligations imposed upon the City by law to finance the fiscal year July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011? - ARTICLE 3.** Shall the voters appropriate the sum of \$15,579,403 necessary for the support of the public school system for the fiscal year July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011? (Local budget of \$14,715,484 plus grant budget of \$863,919, for a total school budget of \$15,579,403.) (Requested by the School Board) YES 1436 NO 695
- ARTICLE 4.** Shall the voters appropriate the sum of \$605,230 for the support of the Recreation Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2011? (Requested by the School Board) YES 1635 NO 468
