

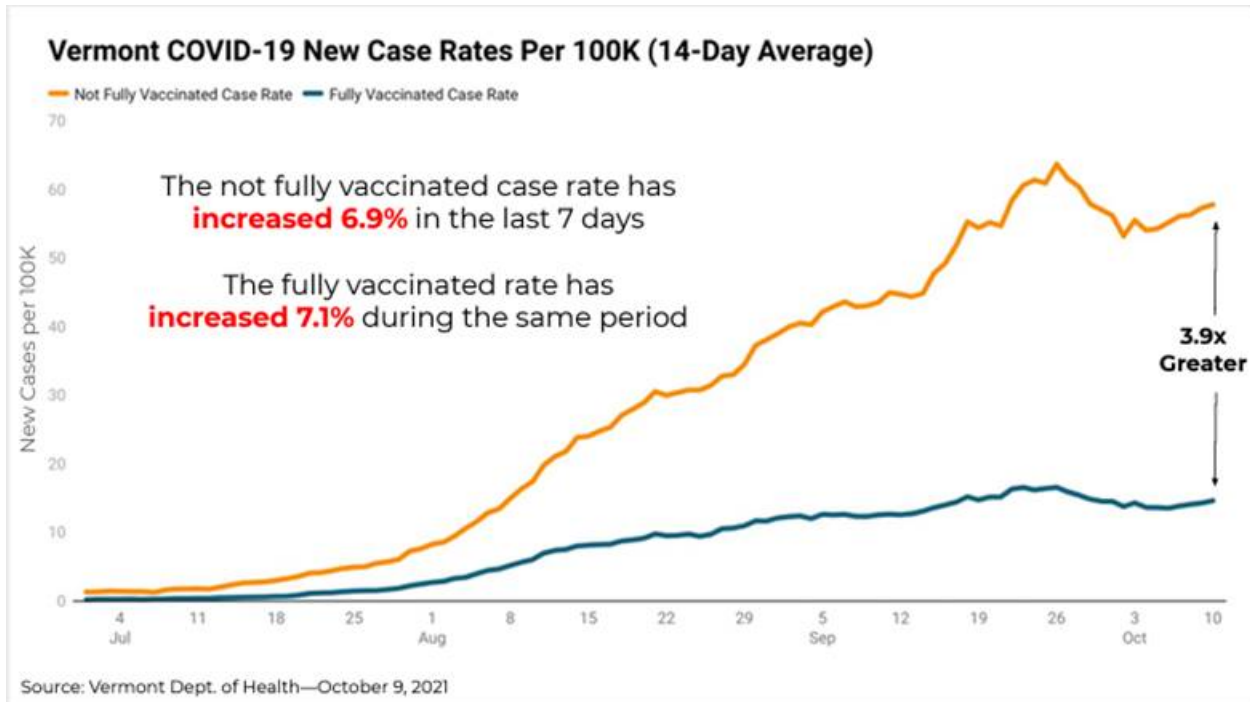

COVID-19 Response- Updated

New: The State has updated their [weekly COVID-19 data report](#). There has been a large shift in our case-rates. **Vermont cases have increased 26% over the last 7 days** and have increased 8% over the last 14 days. However, our overall hospitalization rate is decreasing, and Vermont continues to have fewest hospitalizations per capita nationally.

The CDC continues to list Washington County has a [High Level of Community Transmission](#) and they recommend that everyone in Washington County should wear a mask in public, indoor settings.

You can now get a booster shot of Pfizer vaccine if you received your dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine six months ago or more and are:

- age 65 or older; or
- age 18 or older with certain medical conditions that put you at high risk of getting severely ill with COVID-19; or
- age 18 or older who are more likely to be exposed to or spread COVID because of where you work (including: First Responders, education staff, public transit, grocery store employees, and other);
 - Those who live or work in congregate settings will also be eligible. This includes long-term care facilities, homeless shelters, and correctional facilities
- age 18 or older and are Black, Indigenous or a person of color (BIPOC) or are age 18 or older and live with someone who is BIPOC.

Capital Area Neighborhood Project Management RFP Issued **New**

The City of Montpelier is seeking Proposals from a vendor to provide a management structure and the staffing capacity to assist the City in community outreach on a neighborhood level through the Capital Area Neighborhood (CAN) program. The City's goal is to partner with a vendor who can assist in facilitating more robust community/City connection, and to act as another level of outreach and information sharing. The City has a loosely established network of neighborhood groups, called the

“Capital Area Neighborhoods” that the City is aiming to reinforce and expand. The selected vendor will be responsible for maintaining and building these Capital Area Neighborhood networks, partnerships, and supportive infrastructure. City-wide Reappraisal Gets Underway- Property Inspections to Begin Next Week **New**

This notice is to inform you that the City will be starting the process of a city-wide reappraisal of all real property soon. State law mandates that a reappraisal be conducted when the CLA (Common Level of Appraisal) falls below 85%. With property values continuing to rise, Montpelier’s CLA fell to 84.44% in the State’s 2020 Annual Equalization Study and will fall further in December 2021 when the 2021 Equalization Study is completed.

Anticipating this, the City issued an RFP in February 2020 and awarded a contract for the project in October 2020. The selected firm is New England Municipal Consultants of Lyndon Center, VT, the same firm that did the last city-wide reappraisal in 2010. The process will be completed for the 2023 Grand List.

The first step in this project requires representatives of New England Municipal Consultants (NEMC) to visit each property in the city to gather data. The inspection process will start in late 2021 and continue through the spring of 2023. NEMC will mail notices to property owners in advance of conducting inspections.

Strategic Planning Process Continues: Updated

Given that this item was postponed during this week’s meeting, staff will prepare a final draft of the plan for 10/27 using the preliminary rankings for initiatives. The Council will have the opportunity to make changes prior to final adoption. This will include the Vision, Mission, and Values statements, the Strategic Priorities, and the ranked initiatives.

General Business Follow Up:

10/13

Capital Fire Mutual Aid. No confusion exists about the status of the contract. It was approved unanimously on 9/22 as part of the consent agenda. Despite suggestions that former Council Richardson raised questions, the meeting video shows that he was neither present nor a council member when this vote was taken. Council Member McCullough asked that the item be pulled from the consent agenda, then withdrew his request.

Response to 911 call. An allegation was raised that a 911 call was mishandled for an injured person. The context of the call was not completely explained. The initial call indicated that a person was stumbling around. There was no suggestion of injury or emergency. The police prioritized their response accordingly. Because there was no

suggestion of injury, the ambulance was not dispatched. It was reported again by the person who raised the issue at the meeting but the location was not provided. Once the police located the individual in question and observed injuries, the ambulance was dispatched immediately. There was no dispatch error involved.

District Heat: Staff is continuing to look at this issue and seek solutions for those entities whose capacity was readjusted upwards by a significant amount after an overall system review.

Public Gatherings: The expressed concerns will be shared with Montpelier Alive. The city and its partners will continue to follow guidance from CDC and the Vermont Department of Health.

Challenger Monument Relocation

If you're taking a walk down the bike path across from the High School, you might notice an unusual piece of stonework in front of the raised bed gardens and fruit trees. Stopping to inspect the situation, you'll discover a memorial to the Space Shuttle Challenger. This is a fitting relocation for the monument, as Christa McAuliffe, a teacher, was one of seven individuals on the Challenger mission. The stonework has spent the better part of its memorial lifespan at the base of National Life Drive and was recently moved to its new location as a permanent installation. The relocation was supported by National Life and Arts Management Services in conjunction with Montpelier's Public Works. A rededication ceremony is being planned to occur in the next few weeks.

Can you see the morning fog start to settle in the fields? Can you feel the first bite of chill in the mornings? It goes like this: clear the plants from a field. Rake the field. Plant a cover crop. Water. Noah Sexton – October Volunteer Profile for Montpelier Senior Activity Center by Neville Berle

If you've graduated to elderhood, if it's getting to be that time on a Tuesday, if your stomach is rumbling, you may be thinking about Meals on Wheels, and listening for a knock at the door. It comes, you answer, and there stands Noah Sexton, smiling as he delivers your lunch.

Noah's winding path to your door began long ago in the tiny, mountain town of Shawsville, Virginia. Growing up poor on a dirt road, he absorbed two key lessons from his father: respect all people, and get a good education. Noah took those words to heart. After graduating high school, he worked highway construction seven days a week, saving up for a first year at Virginia Tech. On completing freshman year, he applied to the United States Naval Academy and graduated as a commissioned officer. Noah's tour of duty took him to the Mediterranean, then to the war in Vietnam; upon discharge, he began a successful, thirty-year career in sales.

Fast forward to 2014. Noah retires and moves to Montpelier; he meets and marries Jeanne, who introduces him to some of Vermont's outdoor pleasures. They love snowshoeing on cold winter days, and in summer, go kayaking, or biking. At home, they're often reading-- fiction or nonfiction--and share a passion for gardening. Noah and Jeanne wished to be more engaged with the Montpelier community, and on a whim, tried MSAC's popular "Rockin' and Reelin'" class with teacher John Harrison. They loved singing harmonies to old pop tunes, getting to know their neighbors. Then after class one day, Noah noticed a line forming in the community room, went to investigate, and discovered the FEAST Meals on Wheels program. He knew instantly it was right for him.

Now years into volunteering, Noah treasures chats with friends along his delivery route; he understands what a hot meal can mean to a neighbor in need, and insists he gets
